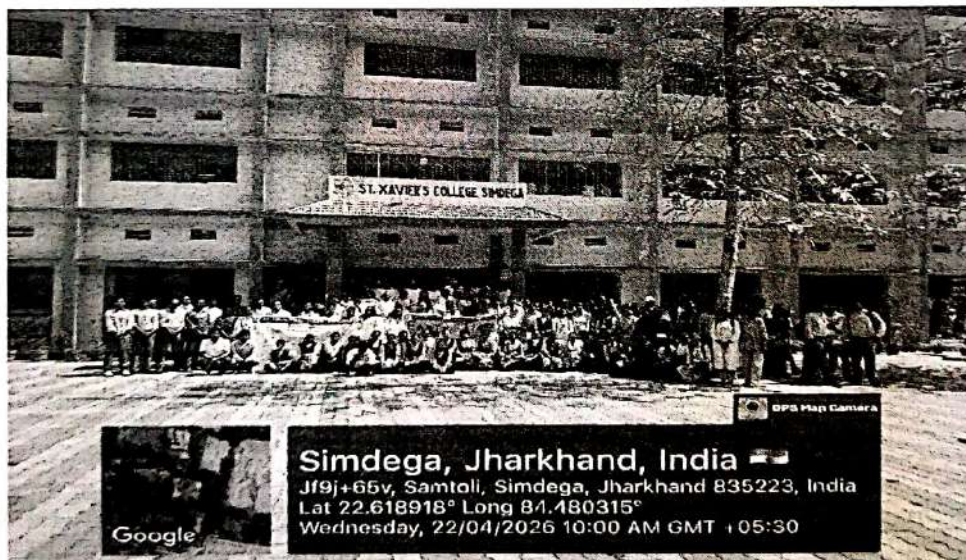

- To provide a platform for student-led advocacy and leadership.

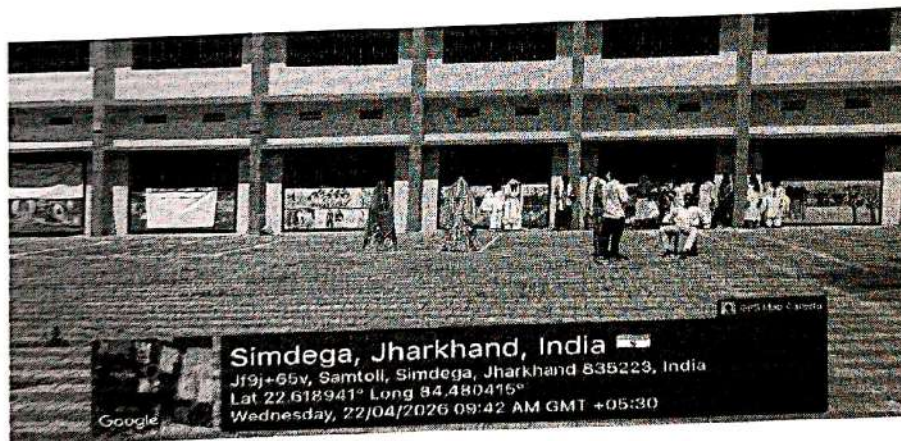


4. Events Overview

A. Awareness campaign

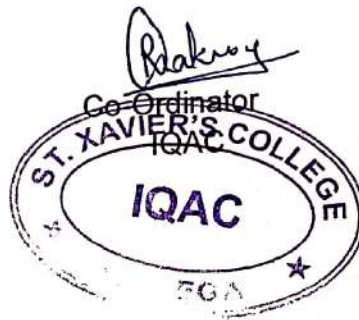
6. Conclusion
